ض as an Arabic letter is transliterated as (d), and as a Persian/Turkish/Urdu letter as (ż).

g as an Arabic letter is transliterated as (w), and as a Persian/Turkish/Urdu letter is transliterated as (v).

4 is transliterated as (ah) in pause form and as (at) in construct form.

Article  $\mathcal{O}$  is transliterated as (al-) whether followed by a moon or a sun letter, however, in construct form it will be transliterated as ('1).
